- Level ground
- Early sun & shade at mid day
- Water nearby
- Plenty of room for Beekeeper to work on the hive
- Irregular layout pattern for Hives
- Safe flight path

- Screen Hives from neighbours
- Be aware of bee flight path.
- Keep them flying high. Use screen or hedge.
- ☐ Inspect when your neighbours are not enjoying their
- Remember cleansing flights and the washing.
- Have a "bolt hole" arranged.
- □ Remember , neighbours can use Public Nuisance Statutes.




